THE CHOCO INDIANS LIVE IN THE DARIEN JUNGLE ON BOTH SIDES OF THE PANAMANIAN FRONTIER WITH COLOMBIA. THE

CHOCO BELIEVE THAT THEIR SHAMAN ARE BORN WITH INNATE SUPERNATURAL POWERS GIVING THEM AN ABILITY TO
PEER INTO THE WORLD OF THE SPIRIT AND TO DIVINE THE CAUSES OF A PERSON'S SICKNESS. THESE FINELY CARVED
EFFIGY STAFFS WERE IMPORTANT RITUAL HEALING TOOLS USED BY THE SHAMAN TO PURGE ILLNESS. THE STAFFS ARE
OFTEN REFERRED TO BY THE SHAMAN AS THEIR 'HELPERS' AS THEY FIGURE PROMINENTLY IN BOTH MEDICINAL CURING
AND CHANTS.
